
Jean Agnes Smith Matthews, 101 years old, passed away at home on Friday, January 28th, 2022. Jean was born on October 5, 1920, in Moline, Illinois

to Herbert G. and Marguerite B. Smith. She graduated from Augustana College & Theological Seminary with a degree in Education. She was chosen most beautiful and was featured in *Look Magazine* in June 1941.

Jean married William Dale Matthews (Bill/Baca) on April 26, 1942, in the Augustana Chapel. For the next season of her life, Jean was a devoted wife and loving mother to William Meredith, Susan Jean, Thomas Bryson, Patricia Linwood, and her brother Jerome Nelson Smith who joined the family in 1952.

ECUMENICAL PRAYER SERVICE


