We are honored to have Dr. Deborah Byrd leading the event. Dr. Byrd has been providing seminars, in-services, conference breakouts, workshops, and retreats since 1988.

Her trainings and retreats are wideranging in focus, include a variety of components, and are tailored to meet the specific needs of the participants. Her positive and enthusiastic teaching style along with workshop elements of interaction, humor, skill-building, resource development, and networking - provide concepts that may be utilized both personally and professionally by individuals, teams, groups, and entire organizations.

Dr. Byrd maintains a private practice while also working at Naval Air Station Corpus Christi providing briefs, trainings, and retreats. She has facilitated one-to-three-day retreats for people with a variety of backgrounds including those in recovery, youth, women, individuals, couples, and families.

She also provides retreats for organizations including Girl Scouts, churches of various denominations, private corporations, and government agencies, including the military.



As followers of Jesus, we are called to worship, connect, grow, serve, and invite. Many opportunities are available for everyone to become involved and take part in serving your church. On Sunday, March 5, Elders were available to discuss the many opportunities for service. In case you were not able to attend during fellowship, you can still obtain information or sign up to participate in any one of the committees. Most committees meet once a month.

The Worship Committee, led by Glendon Sword, plans the worship services for the church and is actively involved with the music including the choir, liturgists, Communion, special events, and ushers along with offering collection.

The Administration Committee is led by Ryan Barbato and is responsible for planning, overseeing, and carrying out the business of the church. Duties include budget, church directory, custodial duties, finances, newsletter, office administration and equipment, building and grounds, and personnel. The Building and Grounds Committee, part of Administration, is led by Gary Uhlenhaker. This group is responsible for maintenance, improvements, and use of the entire FPC campus including cleaning, dormitory use, facility use requests, landscaping, maintenance and repairs, mechanical systems, renovation and upgrades, and sound system improvement.





The Connecting Committee is responsible for fellowship and caring for everyone in the church family. Cathy Bowlin oversees this committee, which offers many opportunities to serve. They oversee the fellowship after each church service, funerals, special events, and care of the at-home covenant partners, including taking Communion to those unable to attend church.

Discipleship/Evangelism Committee is led by Matthew Anderson and Lisa Clark. Their primary goal is to make disciples of Jesus among children, youth, and adults. They are involved with Sunday School, small prayer groups, Wednesday night fellowship, youth ministry, young adults, and family ministries. They also manage scholarships, stewardship, confirmation classes, and the library. They are also involved with bringing new members into the church through Evangelism, sharing the good news of Jesus with those outside our congregation. They put on the Inquirer's Dinners and also maintain bulletin boards, greeters, publicity, brochures, and the website.

The Serving Committee, under the direction of Terry Smith, is responsible for planning, coordinating, and engaging the members of the congregation (and others) in serving others – in the church, the community, and around the world. This includes domestic missions, local missions, and international missions. Annual activities include toiletry, diaper, backpack, and the Presbyterian Children's Home Service Angel Tree drives.
