Be sure to check out our new online public catalog at firstprescc.library.site (*no www*). You can type it into your browser or go to the church website where you will find a link.

We have approximately 5,000 books in our collection, and only 1,000 are in the system. Check back frequently because books are being added every day.

If you are interested in checking out a book, swing by the library anytime the church is open. For right now, we are going to be checking out books the old-fashioned way by signing the card in the front of the book and leaving the card on the desk. Check your email in mid-July for instructions on how to obtain a library card and use the self-checkout kiosk that will be available in August.
