Diapers, diapers, diapers! Our main serving project this summer is to help the Pregnancy Center provide diapers to young families. An average baby will go through six to 10 diapers in **one** day.

Last year, the Pregnancy Center distributed over **251,000 diapers** to parents participating in our Health Initiatives Parenting Program (HIPP) called "Earn While You Learn."

The Diaper Drive runs until Father's Day, June 18. **Any size** of diaper is greatly appreciated, but the Pregnancy Center has a tremendous need for sizes 4, 5, and 6.

Diaper wipes are always appreciated as well. Our church is an official KBNJ dropoff location, and church members can also participate by bringing diapers until Father's Day. Collection receptacles will be available both in the Narthex and the entry by the Living Room. We are hoping to exceed our 2022 record of 5,197 diapers collected.

Not in the mood to shop! The Serving Committee members will shop for you. Just deposit a check noted "diaper drive" or cash in the Narthex collection receptacle.

MERCI AWARD PRESENTED TO PATTY NUSS



The Merci Award was established several years ago by the Women of the Church to convey grateful appreciation for service to our church. The 2023 Merci Award was presented at the Annual Meeting to long-time First Presbyterian Church member, Patty Nuss.

Patty says First Pres is woven into the fabric of her life. She and her husband, Hank, were married in our Sanctuary in 1960. After living away from Corpus Christi for three years, they returned to make their life together here in 1964 and to make First Pres part of that life.

Almost at once, Patty began teaching Sunday School, preferring grades 5 through high school. Though she was a busy mother of three, she taught Communion Confirmation classes and led and participated in Vacation Bible schools for many summers.

She became so involved in education in the church, that she was asked to become the Christian Education director by then-pastor Jack Bennett. She recruited teachers, conducted teacher workshops, and ordered and distributed curriculum.

Patty has worn many hats at First Pres, always with a pleasant smile and kind words. She served twice as an Elder and has been Clerk of Session. She had served on the pastoral search committees for three different ministers. was the chair of the nominating committee for Session, and the chair of the Evangelism Committee.

She served on the Decorating Committee when the new wing was added to our church. Our welcoming living room with its beautiful antiques are a product of that committee.

Working with people on projects and building relationships were vital to Patty. In the beginning of her time at First Pres, she was part of a circle of young women who developed lifelong friendships over monthly luncheons and Bible study sessions.

She was a longtime member of our church's Circle of Love. For several years, she stepped up to lead that circle's Bible study. In time, she became active in the Women of the Church and was elected president of the board in 1974.

Patty has been involved in numerous community and cultural organizations, but she says her relationship with Jesus and his body, the church, was always her priority.

Patty's name has been added to the permanent plaque by the Women of the Church office door, and she was presented a gift of ceramic cross.
